**THE SANDOVAL COUNTY CLERK’S OFFICE ROLLS OUT UPDATED WEBSITE
TO INCREASE EASE OF ACCESS TO INFORMATION**

Interactive tools for finding voting site locations and more information related to the Clerk’s Office functions are among the updated features

Bernalillo, N.M., April 26, 2024—**Sandoval County Clerk Anne Brady-Romero** announced today that the Clerk’s Office website has been updated to better serve county residents. “This Office is committed to delivering the best possible customer service to county residents, and our updated website has been designed to do just that,” Ms. Brady-Romero explained. “For example, *Early Voting* begins May 18, 2024, and residents now can go to the website and use an interactive tool to find their nearest and/or most convenient voting location for either *Early Voting* or *Election Day*,” she shared.

“Also, we’ve expanded our online capabilities to include scheduling an appointment for a marriage license and accessing more details regarding property records requests, such as deeds, plats, mortgages, and marriage licenses,” Ms. Brady-Romero said. With the new website updates, county residents and business owners can more readily view all of the services offered by the Clerk’s Office and where applicable, there are links to additional agency websites and resources. The goal is simple: Provide residents with the most information in a format that is best for them: online, on the phone, by email, or in-office visit.
