# New Mexico Horse Council Foundation Scholarship \$500 awarded to a graduating New Mexico high school senior

Applications for the Scholarship are available in <u>Word</u> or <u>pdf</u>.

Download form, complete, and mail back with all required attachments no later than April 1.

The NM Horse Council Foundation Scholarship is awarded to a graduating NM high school senior upon acceptance and enrollment in a post-secondary educational program. Scholarship funds will be disbursed directly to the ed-

ucational institution upon proof of enrollment.

The basis for selection includes: demonstration of academic excellence, demonstrated personal character and initiative, contribution to the horse community, demonstrated commitment to horses and others, demonstrated leadership and/or involvement with horses that benefited others more than self, and writing skills. A sample evaluation rubric is available from the NMHC Foundation.

**ELIGIBILITY**: Scholarship is open to graduating high school seniors in New Mexico.

#### **APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS:**

- 1. Two Letters of Recommendation (letter from relative is unsuitable):
  - a. One from a teacher or school official
  - b. One from an adult horseperson from the NM horse community
- 2. Certified copy of academic transcript
- 3. Statement identifying your academic achievements
- 4. Statement identifying your community activities and examples of leadership
- 5. One Essay Discuss how your involvement with the horse community has benefited you and influenced your educational and life goals. (200 300 words).

Scholarship winner will be required to provide student identification number and proof of enrollment in post-secondary educational institution prior to distribution of award to the institution.

#### **DEADLINE FOR APPLICATION: April 1**

LATE OR INCOMPLETE APPLICATIONS WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED.

#### 4-H CLUB LEADERS and Adult Volunteers

Each year Adult Leaders and Volunteers must renew and complete the New Mexico 4-H Working with Minors certification for working directly with our youth. This course may be taken online through the Clover Academy in ZSuite or offered in person by Brittany or Madeline at your club meeting.

- 1. Click on Clover Academy on the left menu bar
- 2. Launch NM Working with Minors (even though it says completed/100%)
- 3. New Volunteers—just clilck 'Start'.
- 4. Scroll to the bottom of the page
- 5. Click on the blue button next to NM Working with Minors
- 6. Start Course

After completing the course, click Completion Certificate and a certificate will be available with the completion date. Make a copy of the certificate, save in a pdf file and email to the extension office—sandoval@nmsu.edu

NOTE: Adult enrollments will only be approved by the State 4-H office if you are enrolled online, have your medical release uploaded into zsuite, have an approved background check, and have passed the Working with Minors module in zsuite.

You must attend at least 40% of your Club Meetings by July in order to exhibit your Livestock (or any 4-H Exhibit) at the Sandoval Co. Fair.

# IMPORTANT FROM THE STATE 4-H OFFICE! CHOOSING YOUR 4-H PROJECTS That are Self-Determined

#### LIVESTOCK

Beef, Swine, Lamb, Goat, Poultry, Rabbit, Dog, Cat, Small pets

You must attend at least 40% of your Club Meetings in order to exhibit your livestock at the Sandoval County Fair. Club Leaders will be monitoring monthly club meeting attendance. 4-H LIVESTOCK SELF-DETERMINED PRJECTS NEED A SELF=-DETERMINED RECORD SHEET. Self-determined livestock and items without a sheet will be disqualified from the fair.

#### **SELF-DETERMINED PROJECTS—i.e., Arts & Crafts, etc.**

Arts & Crafts are self-determined projects. They are listed in zsuite as self-determined when you choose Arts & Crafts. To submit your Arts & Crafts at the Sandoval County Fair, a self-determined record sheet must accompany the exhibit, or it will be disqualified for 4-H competition.

If a self-determined record sheet does not accompany the exhibit, your craft exhibit(s) will be moved to the open exhibit class, and will not qualify, if placed first in Open, for the New Mexico State Fair.

#### THE REQUIREMENTS WRITTEN HEREIN ARE SUBJECT TO CHANGE AT ANY TIME DUE TO ANIMAL HEALTH ISSUES THAT MAY ARISE

Before entering any New Mexico county or state fair, all in-state junior livestock (cattle, sheep, goats and swine) to be shown must have application of an approved NM Youth Exhibitor Fair Tag by an Extension Agent, FFA Advisor or designated Fair personnel and have a New Mexico Livestock Board (NMLB) Form 1 Inspection. NMLB personnel will prepare the Form 1 Inspection for the Show Season at the time of Youth Exhibitor Fair Tag application in the project animal. The Form 1 Inspection Form will serve as a form of ownership for the junior livestock exhibitor.

\*\*\*The County Extension Agent is responsible for maintaining required records of Youth Exhibitor Fair Tag applications\*\*\*

Youth Exhibitor New Mexico Fair (NMF) Tag will be an official New Mexico State 4-H issued USDA 840 series tag.

New Mexico State 4-H Issued NMF tags are to be placed in the ear at tagging by a County 4-H Agent, FFA instructor, or approved designee. If a scannable 840 tag is currently in the ear, then that tag number is to be recorded on official records for project identification. If an existing 840 tag is in place that does not scan, then the 840 number is to be recorded and the animal will also be tagged with a State 4-H issued, scannable, 982 series tag. All exhibitors must meet tagging/validation day requirements set for their county.

THE NMLB FORM 1 INSPECTION FOR THE SHOW SEASON MUST OCCUR BEFORE JULY 15<sup>th</sup> OF THE CURRENT SHOW SEASON.

AND
IS VALID UNTIL OCTOBER 31<sup>st</sup> OF THE CURRENT SHOW SEASON.

To exhibit livestock or projects for County Fair, or receive scholarships, you must be in good 4-H standing—i.e., you must be fully enrolled, and you must have attended at least 40% of ALL club meetings, and participated in the Sandoval County Fair 4-H Clean-Up Day.

This includes Council Officers attendance at 4-H County Council meetings.

# **4-H Member Ages For 2024-2025 4-H Year Before January 1, 2025**

**CLOVERBUD:** 5 to 8, years old AND in Kindergarten, 1st or 2nd grade 9 to 11 years old, or 8 years old AND in the 3rd grade. 12 and 13 years old, or 11 years old AND in 6th grade.

**SENIOR:** 14 to 18 years old or 13 years old AND in 8th grade

Youth who are 19 on or by December 31 of the current 4-H year (2024) are NOT eligible to enroll as a 4-H member.

#### Scholarship Information

A Scholarship fund has been established by the 4-H County Council to provide financial assistance to 4-H members that wish to attend State, District, or County 4-H events. Scholarship will cover 50% of the registration expenses for Senior Leadership Retreat, Youth-Get-Away, Livestock School, Horse School, FCS School, 4-H Dog School, or \$250 of the team fees for serving as a State 4-H Officer, Ambassador, or a Diplomat. The scholarship will cover 100% of the registration expenses for 4-H County Camp.

The funding may not be used to attend State 4-H Conference, State 4-H Shooting Sports Contest, nor District Contest.

**Scholarship Criteria**—Available to any Novice, Junior or Senior 4-H Member.

# State 4-H Office Community Service & Scholarship Information

If a youth is interested in attending one of the annual events and are looking for a way to assist with registration costs they can apply for the New Mexico 4-H Community Service Scholarship. The scholarship will cover the registration expenses for Senior Leadership Retreat, Youth Get-Away, Livestock School, Horse School, State 4-H Conference, 4-H International Exchange, FCS School, 4-H Dog School or \$250 of the team fees for serving as a State 4-H Officer or Ambassador.

The applicant can create their own community service or if they would like to work with an organization in creating a new program that is acceptable. The project must be an activity that the youth designs, organizes and implements that will have an impact on the community. Scholarship Applications for the events are due two months before the event registration deadline. Forms must be filled out online when submitting applications. The application is approved or declined by a committee. If declined, the applicant will be asked to provide further information on the proposal.

If the applicant submitted a scholarship application for an event and received the scholarship, they need to have their community service report complete and submitted to the State 4-H Office before they can apply for the community service scholarship for any future events.
