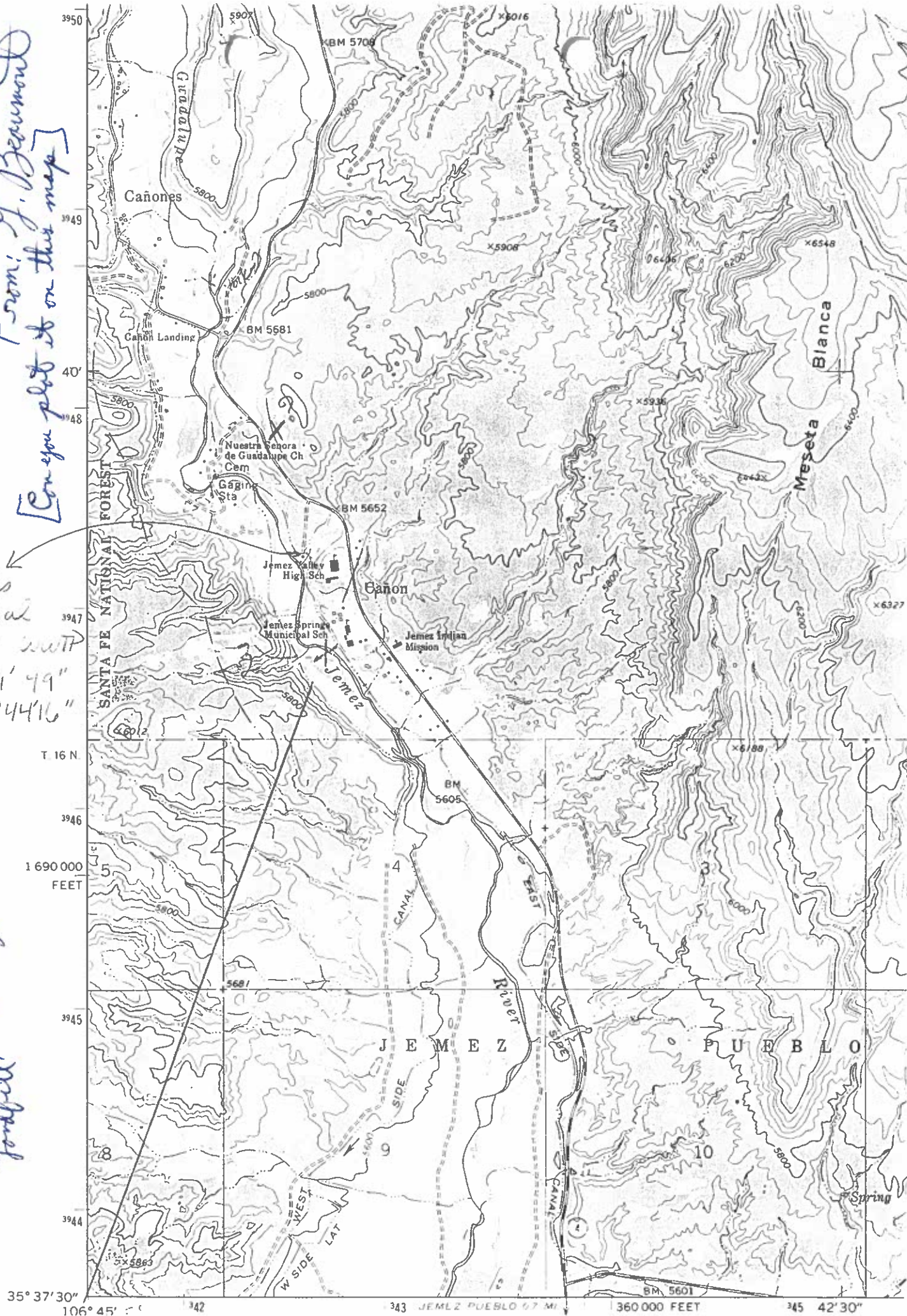

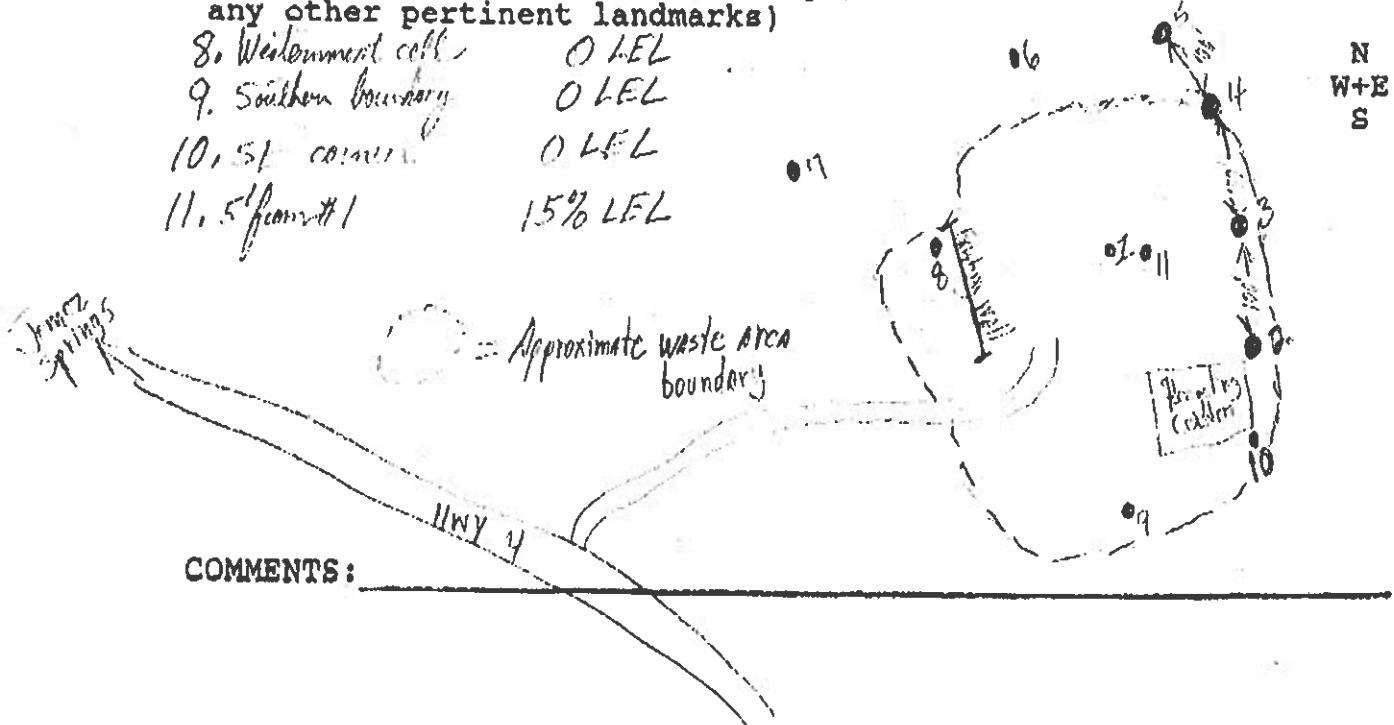

SUBJECT: Canon/Jemez Mountain vs. Jemez Springs Landfill Site

I have a Forest Service Map of the Santa Fe National Forest, that shows two landfill sites. The Jemez Springs site in T.18N. R.02E., may have started as an illegal dump that was closed around 1984.

The Canon/Jemez Mountain Landfill, in projected Section 33, T.17N. R.02E, was registered with the Department on November 2, 1974. It consisted of 33 acres with 22 useable acres. According to Terry Nelson (met with Bob Crostic with the Jemez Springs Forest Service Office), this landfill was closed in November of 1991, and converted to the Canon Transfer Station. Debbie Hayes, the new Sandoval County Manager, has informed me that she will obtain a consultant and proceed with the Closure Plan. Landfills closed after May 14, 1989, and prior to October 30, 1992, were subject to the closure post closure provisions contained in Section 302 of the 1989 Solid Waste Management Regulations.

NOTICE OF VIOLATION

Dear Mr. Abouselman:

On June 23, 1993, Terry Nelson of the New Mexico Environment Department inspected the Sandoval County Canon Transfer Station in response to complaints from residents in Jemez Springs. On numerous occasions, residents arrived at the site to find the container full and solid waste was dumped on the ground. They also observed County employees burying waste on site to address the problem.

During the inspection, Mr. Nelson observed a large pile of solid waste on the ground. He passed three loaded vehicles on their way to the landfill that had come from the site at around 10:30 a.m. The one waste container at the site was almost full at 10:45 a.m. There was litter scattered all around the site. There was also evidence that waste had recently been buried on site.

An adequate number of containers need to be provided to handle all waste brought to the site. Waste should not be dumped on the ground. Burying waste on site is considered landfilling which jeopardizes the closure of the landfill. Section 106.F of the Regulations requires storage facilities be insect and rodent-proof and be kept reasonably clean and sanitary. It was evident that the existing containers were not keeping up with the amount of waste being brought to the facility and as a result the waste was being piled on the ground allowing for excess litter and vector harborage.

The Department is requesting your voluntary cooperation in resolving this matter. Please provide a written response within 10 days of receipt of this letter, indicating the steps you have taken or plan to take to correct the problems noted. Failure to reply or take corrective action will lead to further enforcement action.
